May 2019 Carolina sniffed through an impressive **2,163 samples** scoring an **accuracy rate of 87.8%**. Her sensitive nose identified **an additional 50 cases**



of tuberculosis (TB) that were originally missed by local clinics. Those 50 people, following confirmation by World Health Organization approved tests, will be able to start treatment. With support from local clinics and partners, they'll also be better able to recognize the signs of tuberculosis and keep an eye out for it amongst family and friends.




